

Class 1: Composition Writing Workshop

1. Overview

Writing a good picture composition is not a difficult task if students take note of the main points that they need to observe in their writing.

2. Answering questions

To do well for this part, you must write your composition in a fluent and logic flow that is easy and captivating for your marker. It is also important to write your story with a 'twist', 'climax' or an 'excitement' to make it interesting.

Students must also be careful with their grammar usage when they write the composition and know how to improve their expressions with the suitable words and phrases to better describe the story.

There are a few main areas of development which you need to consider writing a good picture comprehension:

- 1. What is the event?
- 2. Who is in the story?
- 3. What are the activities?

Example

Today is my school's annual sports day. The school has organized many activities for the students. The events are going to be held in the school field. There are events such as soccer, sprint relays and basketball. Many students have signed up for the activities. John, Peter and I are taking part in the basketball event. We have trained very hard for the event and hope to do well.

3. What is the event?

Students must get an idea on what they are writing which means they must know what the event they are writing about.

Students must write the following:

- name of the event
- where and when it is held
- the character or people in the story

Example

James signed up for a singing competition. The singing competition is happening this Saturday at Bishan Community Centre. James is nervous and excited at the same time. His parents and his best friend, Kate, will be there to support him.

4. Who is in the story?

It is also important to name the people in your story and give a brief description about them.

- i) Name the people in your story
- ii) Give a guick description of the people

Example

When I walked into the stadium, I immediately saw my cheerful and helpful teacher, Mr Tan, helping my classmates to move some sport equipment to the field.

5. What are the activities?

Students need to set the activities in the story and describe the activities in an orderly manner. Write out what has happened in your story.

- i) State the main activities in your story
- ii) Describe what has happened

Example

During the competition, Peter was very nervous when he saw how skilful the other contestants were. As a result of his carelessness, he poured in salt instead of sugar into the cake batter mixture. Mary was livid and they got into a huge disagreement. However, they soon calmed down and collected themselves. They had to make the cake all over again but this time with a tighter timeframe. Mary came up with a plan to maximize their efficiency and to work well together. Peter was strong, thus he was in charge of maxing the cake batter. Mary was careful and had an eye for detail, thus she did the icing decoration for the cake. By capitalising each of their strengths, they were able to make a beautiful chocolate cake within the short timeframe that they had.

6. Develop your story

When you develop your story, you must make the story a sequence. Divide the story into paragraphs like at the start, in the middle and at the end. Connect your story with 'connecting phrases'

- i) Make sure the story is sequential
- ii) Develop your sequence of story based on paragraphs
- Start
- Middle
- End
- iii) Connect your parts of story with words like 'After this, 'Subsequently' and 'Immediately'

7. Describe your activities and people in your story

Use adjectives, adverbs and phrases to describe the character in your story and activities.

Example

As I walked towards the starting line, my heart was pounding as I was nervous and anxious. To calm myself, I remembered vividly what my teacher had said about being calm and relaxed in a race.

8. How do you make your story more interesting

- i) Create a 'twist' or 'climax' in your story
- ii) Create a lesson to be learnt from your story like 'Teamwork is not only to be successful, it is also for building friendship' as your ending

Example

He was very upset that his friends did not remember his birthday. He walked home sadly and when he opened the door, he saw his friends and family holding a cake. They sang a birthday song for him. The surprise celebration was a success!

Example

Today, he learnt the importance of being honest. Lying will hurt the feelings of those that are lost to him, causing them to lose trust.

9. What are the mistakes you must avoid?

Be careful with your use of tenses, prepositions and nouns.

10. Make sure your sentences are correctly constructed.

- i) Avoid spelling errors.
- ii) Make sure your handwriting is readable.
